## Water Intoxication: Too Much of a Good Thing

Most dog owners are more concerned about a dehydrated pet than one that is hyper-hydrated. But the fact is some dogs can ingest dangerous amounts of water in a short period of time.

Water intoxication, resulting in potentially fatal condition that play in the water. Retrieving with other retrieving dogs is water very quickly. Another garden hose or sprinkler.

intoxication include loss of coordination, glazed eyes, excessive salivation, difficulty

It's important to monitor dogs that are very active in the water, and insist on regular rest breaks. Also take care not to allow your dog to ingest an excessive amount of water from a hose or sprinkler. Dogs that empty their water bowl after hard play or exercise should be rested for a bit before refilling the bowl.

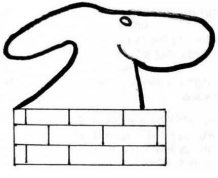
Hyponatremia is a potentially fatal condition, so if your dog has played in water and shows any symptoms of water intoxication, get him to your vet or an emergency animal hospital immediately.

Two courses of runs (one with 3 levels). Walk-thrus start at 8:30am; judging from 9am-12pm. Runs are \$5 each; cash or check (no credit or debit cards). AKC style only. Judges (Ruth Ann Van Dyke and Norina Blynn) will be available for guidance, no scoring. **Due to limited parking, you must reserve a parking space!** There are five parking spaces available each hour, beginning at 8:30 (8:30, 9:30, 10:30, etc.) – you may sign up for as many runs as you would like.

**Directions:** (DO NOT CONSULT GOOGLE MAPS!) **From I-81 North or South:** Exit 77 (Manada Hill/Hershey Exit; Rt. 39), east toward Hershey. Proceed just over 1 mile the traffic signal at Rt. 22; make a left (north) onto Rt. 22. Proceed 2.5 miles north on Rt. 22 then make a right onto Sand Beach Road. Proceed 2.3 miles on Sand Beach Road, then left onto Level Road. Make first right onto driveway for the large barn with the green roof.

**From I-83:** in Harrisburg, take I-83 to 322 East to Hershey. Take exit for Hersheypark Attractions – Rt. 39. Go about 2 miles and make a left to stay onto Rt. 39. After about a half mile, make a right onto East Canal Street. After about 1.4 miles, East Canal Street ends at Sand Beach Road. Make a left onto Sand Beach Road. Proceed for about 1.2 miles, make a right onto Level Road. Make first right onto driveway for the large barn with the green roof.

Please park on the left unless you need handicapped parking, which is at the top of the parking lot, immediately in front of the barn. Potty area and entrance to barn are on the left as you are facing the barn.

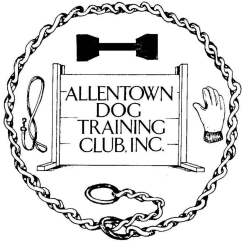
