Welcome to our June newsletter. Our outdoor training has started and so have the hot summer nights. Remember, it does take some time for our dogs to get used to working outside with all the distractions. But this is an excellent time to work not only on the exercises but more important is their attention to you and not on the environment around them. This is probably the most important thing your dog can learn this summer. Some dogs are easier to teach attention than others. I have had more than my share of problems teaching Cooper that he MUST pay attention to me and not to all the other dogs in the next class who he thinks may be having more fun than he is. You can make use of "down time" while waiting for your turn to do an exercise by having your dog pay attention to you, even if only for a short period. Then jackpot when he or she gives you attention. Or come early or stay a little later while the next class is going on, and work on your dog's attention. Take advantage of a great opportunity.

Last month there were several trials in our area including our Club Show. For those who felt their dog was ready, we hope you took advantage of not having to drive that far. There will be more and more trials starting up so do check the AKC website, Rau Dog Shows and InfoDog. Remember that the first several trials this year filled quickly so do not wait to enter or you will be waitlisted. It is especially difficult for those trials where you have to mail in the entry. Too early it gets thrown out or a little late beyond the opening date and you are on a waitlist. The electronic entries are so nice and you know immediately you got your entry in on time.


