professional background My in Occupational Therapy working in the field of adult rehabilitation. When I first learned of the volunteer field of therapy dogs, I was excited. I was comfortable in hospital settings and had a Labrador retriever whose overall temperament seemed perfect for this. Her name was Julie. That was over 20 years ago. Since that time 5 of my 7 Labrador retrievers have held the title of registered therapy dogs. Currently Riley age 7 and Barkley age 4 are my therapy dogs. Because of some health issues with Riley, Barkley is my main active therapy dog.

A dog is not eligible to test for therapy dog status until they are one years old. Training involves basic obedience, lots of socialization in various settings and review of and practice of the testing requirements. As a member of the Alliance of Therapy Dogs (ATD) we are required to be observed, as a team, by a qualified tester/observer on 3 supervised visits mainly in medical facilities. Once this is completed, visits can begin.

I am a member of Lehigh Valley Therapy Dogs (LVTD) with ATD as the parent organization. Barkley and I visit a number of facilities including but not limited to hospitals, assistive livings, daycares, libraries, schools including colleges for de stress events and LVIA. Some visits are done individually, and some visits involve other member teams. It is important to note the visits are not only for the patient /students but also for families of the individual and staff. Everyone needs the comfort provided by a therapy dog. Barkley becomes very excited when we prepare for a visit. It is obvious he understands his "job" and enjoys it thoroughly. It is not uncommon for him to flip on his back for belly rubs or lean up against someone to encourage more petting. For more reserved settings he may just rest his head on a bed or a hand. In my opinion, Barkley was born to be a therapy dog and has the ability to provide comfort regardless of the setting.

The 2020 and 2021 Great Pyrenees National Specialty was held in November of this year in Virginia Beach. On November 5 she passed her 5th Draft Dog Test with qualifying scores. She earned some nice prizes and a lovely rosette along with her Advanced Novice Drafting Title.

She also earned several first places for her RALLY MASTER TITLE.

For all this she was awarded a plaque listing her in the GREAT PYRENEES PERFORMANCE HALL OF FAME for having the highest combined score in RALLY ADVANCED B, EXCELLENT B AND MASTER CLASSES.

Judy Skorup reports that Emma had a busy week at her Great Pyrenees National Specialty and then the following weekend at a Regional Swissy Specialty in another part of Virginia. After earning her Great Pyrenees Advanced Novice Draft Title and her Rally Master 3 - plus several awards for high Rally Scores in 2020 and 2021, and her Performance/Obedience Hall of Fame plaque, Emma took a few days off to socialize and prepare for her Open Draft Test (off lead with a three-minute Mom out of sight stay). On Sunday, Emma competed and earned her Agility ACT1 Jumpers certificate/title. She had to jump 10 jumps in the correct order twice without knocking down a bar in under 50 seconds. Success! On Monday, Emma competed in the Swissy Open Draft Test - all off lead with 25 lbs. in the cart on a one-mile up hill and downhill and through the forest trail. It was her first time competing in Open Draft and she passed easily. We have her Draft Dog title, another rosette, and more trophies. In the regional Swissy test, there were Swissies, Leonbergers, Bouviers, Shelties and one Pyrenees. No brace entries this time. Emma is taking today off and tomorrow too. She was getting a bit tired of hotel rooms!

Here are the rosettes and gear bag from the Advanced Novice Draft Test with Title, two first place Rally Master Trials, the plaque for being in the Performance/Obedience Hall of Fame, and trophies for having the highest score in Master Rally, highest High Combined score in Rally Ex.
