

#### Sally Campbell: ADTC Member of the Month



I have been living with Irish setters since the early 1970's. My first Irish had her CDX and was fully trained through UD, but she could not compete due to arthritis. She had to jump 36" and would always clip the bar. She could do 34", but the extra 2" was just too much.

I currently have Mamie, aka Ch Ramblin' Red Slamdunk Hostess with the Mostest, BN, TKN, CGC. Mamie is 6 1/2. We train in obedience, rally, and agility. I met Mamie when she was 9 months old. She had been kept by her breeder, along with a sister and two brothers to be shown in the breed ring. Her breeder soon realized that she needed more attention than could be given in the kennel and asked if I was interested in a dog. I had recently lost Duffy and was looking for another Irish. She was the clown of the litter and definitely needed obedience work. She also needed a lot of activities to keep her occupied, so agility was another activity that we added. I think of all

the activities, we like agility the best. Mamie's tail never stops wagging when we are in the ring. She has a good time, and I like the exercise.

Mamie first completed her championship in the breed ring. She also has 5 points, including one major towards her grand championship. She has earned the beginner novice title, the CGC, and the novice tricks title. She also recently received her P1 Standard title in USDAA agility. She has other Q's in USDAA agility and will continue to compete to earn other titles. She is also working for her Rally Novice title. She has 1 Q, but COVID has put trials on hold for us.

In addition to my membership in ADTC, I am currently a member of the Lehigh Valley Dream Weavers Agility Club and the co-chair of their agility trials. I am involved in other service activities, but none that are dog related. In the 70's I trained with the Lehigh German Shepherd Dog Club, and I was an assistant instructor for their obedience classes. I also judged a few matches in that time span.

In my experience, the biggest challenge with an Irish setter is focus. They are hunting dogs, and their noses tend to get them into trouble. Most also do not respond well to drill. If they have done something once or twice, that's enough. So short training periods work better for them.

I had a male Irish named Wizard, who was competing for his novice obedience title. We were at a trial near Dulles airport in the summer; it was 95+ degrees, with high humidity—a brutally hot day. Wizard had 198 1/2 going into the long sits and downs, and at that time we had to do a one-minute sit and a three minute down, with all the dogs lined up across the ring. He was fine with the long sit, but about one minute into the long down, he looked over at the judge's table, got up, and lay down in the shade for the remaining time. The judge started to laugh, and said in a big southern drawl, "That's one smart dawg." Needless to say, our 1981/2 went south fast.

My advice to new handlers is to work on attention exercises from the beginning. You should become the most important thing in your dog's life.
