It is now Spring, and we are moving our training from the building to outside in the Macungie Park on May 4 and 5. Because we are outside, we are weather dependent. With that said, rain, chance of severe weather such as thunderstorms, and unbearable hot and humid weather can cause training to be cancelled. So be sure to check emails if you think there is a chance training may be cancelled. Sometimes it is raining in one area, with clear sunshine in another so do check to be sure.

Our outdoor training schedule is pretty much the same as it was inside with a few exceptions and it is listed below. Remember to bring water for your dog and bug spray for both of you. For new members, there is parking in the Parking lot, or you can go to the gravel road and park there on the grass. You will see other cars parked there. The training is usually in that area, although since there are several classes going on you need to look for your instructor. The instructors usually will try to hold their classes where there is shade. Again, if you have any questions as to which class you belong in, please talk to your instructor for the best advice. Remember also that it takes your dog (and maybe you as well) several weeks to get used to training outdoors. For you, the footing is uneven but for the dog there are all sorts of sights, smells, other dogs, and many other distractions. The Park is a busy place with other dogs and people not connected to ADTC classes but great distractions for your dog especially if you are planning on entering trials.

We hope that everyone took advantage of our match for club members which was April 27 and 28, especially if you are entered in our upcoming trial in Barto on May 21. Matches are so helpful in seeing where you are in your training or just to get your dog used to going into the ring. Many thanks to our judges and members who helped steward and set up the ring.
