
Here it is April all ready and our point show is fast approaching. More on that in this month's Barks & Bytes Newsletter. We also have Easter to celebrate as well as Spring and hopefully warmer weather approaching. Our new classes are going well, and Terry is making arrangements with Amy to rent the building on Wednesday from noon until Thursday night at 9:00pm starting in September. We are hoping this will open up more time for classes to relieve the number of people attending the novice classes. It is wonderful seeing so many people coming to training with their dogs. But when we go outdoors, please remember that dog training does not take the summer off. You do need to work with your dog even if it is only a few minutes a day. Even when it is hot there are things you can do in the house like practice fronts and finishes, pivots, even close recalls and lots of distractions with family and kids running around.

If you were at the last meeting on March 8, the Allentown Dog Training Club voted to donate \$i,000 toward the purchase of the Macungie Park's Lumber Street property. For those who do not live in this area, the Macungie Memorial Park does not receive tax money to keep it going. It is supported by fund raising and holding events like the Truck Show in June, Das Awkscht Fescht, antique car show, in August, and the Wheels of Time, Street Rod Association Rod Run also in August. There are also many other events held in the "Park" to help maintain it. Macungie Park is so dog friendly and if ADTC and others would lose this

wonderful place, it could never be replaced. So many places are being closed to dogs because of people not cleaning up after them or letting them run loose and getting into trouble. There will be more on the "Park" in this newsletter.

Please be sure to read Training Director, Terry Papineau's report on the survey, which also can be found in this newsletter.

REPORT ON SURVEY

Here are the results of the survey which Terry sent out the other month. She has blessed us with three new classes on Thursday: ATTENTION which is essential for those planning to show their dog in OBEDIENCE, RALLY, and other dog sports, ADVANCED BEGINNING OBEDIENCE—GETTING YOUR DOG READY FOR BEGINNER NOVICE/NOVICE: BEGINNING NOVICE which is great again for those planning on showing their dog in Dog Sports such as obedience, rally, agility and others. And finally, the BEGINNING NOVICE CLASS which is great for those with puppies and young dogs who are just coming out of the puppy class. Prepares you and your dog to go into the other novice classes we offer.

SURVEY RESULTS WRITTEN BY TERRY PAPINEAU

For those of you who took the time to answer the survey, thank you for your suggestions. Some of your suggestions have already been implemented and others are in the works.

Listed are your suggestions and constructive criticisms in no particular order. Many of you asked for an attention class, a tricks class, and a class later in the evening for those who work. In addition, some of you felt there was too much downtime in some of the classes as they were too big. Others asked why we could not have a one ring dog show in our facility in Macungie where our dogs were comfortable working.

As you may or may not be aware, we implemented an attention class on February 2 with 13 members attending the class and a wait list for the next session which will start on March 23. We also added an advanced beginner/beginner 2 class in the evening to accommodate those who work.

I approached the board asking if we could take over additional hours if they were available on Wednesdays. They agreed so when we come back into the building in September, we will be taking over at 12 noon instead of 4:00 p.m. on Wednesday. That gives us more space and time to add classes such as a tricks class, a teaching open or teaching utility class and making our classes a little smaller for more individualized attention. The board has also approved buying some tools of the trade.

As to having a dog show in our facility, that is in progress. Finding a date in the fall, because of no air conditioning (as we already have a show in the spring) was difficult because of the 100 mile "as the crow flies" rule. We were able to come up with the date of November 5 and await AKC

approval. Phyllis has agreed to judge. To keep with AKC requirements, Phyllis will not be able to teach the week before the show so we will have a substitute teacher or a match. I'll let you decide what you prefer. Hopefully some of you will volunteer to help me put on my first show.

I was hoping to have a rally show the day before our obedience show but finding a date was impossible. So I decided to have a rally show the Thursday before our obedience show in November and Linda Krasley has agreed to judge. We will have a match or substitute teacher the week before the rally show and you can decide which you prefer. Again, volunteers will be needed.

I hope that in September I will also be able to offer a little seminar on how to enter a dog show, a match show, what to do at both, what mistakes novice handlers make, what judges look for, etc.

Keep your suggestions coming and I will try my best to implement them.

Gail has also contacted the Boy Scouts and they will be selling food and drinks all day.

MACUNGIE MEMORIAL PARK

At the March 8 general meeting we voted to donate \$1,000 to the "Park" to help finance the purchase of the Lumber Street property which is on the other side of Mountain Creek. It is a 1.6-acre property which the "Park" board approved to maintain the open space of the "Park". Many, many thanks to board member Edie Rysdyk and her husband for matching this grant. Any member can donate to this land purchase and it will be greatly appreciated by the Macungie Park Association and Board. The "Park" is owned by a non-profit organization and does not receive taxpayer funding. During the summer months, the Macungie Farmers Market is held there.

As stated earlier, the "Park" gets its funds to operate from events held throughout the year both in the "Park" itself and the building. Some of these large events are the Antique Truck Show in June, Das Awkscht Fescht, antique car show in August and The Wheels of Time Street Rod Association Rod Run also in August. There are also many other events like craft shows and dog shows among many other events. Volunteer help is always needed to take tickets for the large events and help in the kitchen. All the money from the entrance fees and kitchen help fund the "Park" as well as the rental fees from the building and "Park". You can check out the various events on the "Park" website. You can speak to Jacqui at dog training if you might be interested in giving a few hours to help in the refreshment stand.

We can be so grateful to have this wonderful place to use and train our dogs.


I own and train Cosmopolitan And So It Goes. His call name is CJ (short for Captain Jack), and he is a Cardigan Welsh Corgi.


