

# ADTC BARKS & BYTES NEWSLETTER MAY 2023



Here it is, our May Allentown Dog Training Club BARKS AND BYTES. Our indoor Training sessions have ended, and we will now be training outdoors in the Park for the next several months until sometime in September when we will go indoors. Be sure to check the training schedule as there are a few changes. Also, our Point Show is coming up on May 20 and last year the Rally class was quite large so do not wait too long to enter. The closing date is May 3. Terry is now working on having another Obedience trial on Sunday, November 5. and it has been approved by the AKC. She is also having a Rally Trial on Thursday, November 2, which has also been approved by the AKC. She will need lots of help so mark your calendars to keep these days open when they are announced. We always need stewards and remember, NO STEWARDS, NO OBEDIENCE/RALLY TRIALS.

Since we are now training outside, as in the winter, (and how lucky we were this winter) we are weather dependent. If it is going to be extremely hot or rainy or thunderstorms, please check your email to make sure that classes have not been cancelled. Just because it is clear and sunny in your area, does not mean it is in Macungie and vice versa. Also remember to bring water for yourself and your dog and bug spray for both. Looking forward to seeing everyone at our outdoor training. And it is so important that you keep up training whether here at the park or at home.

### \*TRAINING\*

For those of you in the Beginning Novice classes and Novice classes as well as the Open and Utility classes, should have noticed that Terry and Joanne are using training aids. Terry purchased these items at Top Dog Training School. For those who have trained at Top Dog and have used these training aids here, know how helpful they can be. If anyone is interested in ordering their own training aids/equipment, please get in touch with Terry. She will be glad to order them for you. You must pay for them in advance. I cannot stress what great aids they are, and you can use your own at home when practicing what you learned in class or bring them to class. Please use an address label to mark your own equipment.

### \*TRAINING SCHEDULE\*

Please be sure to read over the outdoor training schedule as there have been a few changes. You should have also received from Deb Achenzie applications to sign up for the new classes. There will be a Beginning Open class which you need to sign up for the next 7 weeks. Because this is a class for learning about the Open exercises, which include dumbbells, dumbbell retrieves, jumping and drop on recall and learning to work with your dog off lead, there will be no drop-ins. The other new class is Beginning Novice. Drop-ins are welcome for this class but please contact Joanne, so she knows that you are coming. Both taught by Joanne Summers.

If you have any questions as to which class you should be entered in, please talk to your instructor. The new BEGINNING OPEN class is for those who want to learn the Open exercises which one can do along with taking the Novice class. The Advanced Beginner class is for those just coming out of the first Beginner Class, but not yet ready for the Novice class.

DROP-INS: FEE FOR DROP-INS IS \$10. Please contact the instructor for the class in which you want to do a drop-in. However, since the BEGINNING OPEN CLASS is a learning class for those who want to learn the Open exercises, there are no drop-ins permitted in this class.

### \*RALLY\*

The Masters session will end on May 4. Linda Krasley will be offering two times for classes. At this point Linda is still not well enough to come back to teaching Rally. Carol Hahn will be teaching Linda's classes until she is able to return. She will accept drop-ins, but you must let her know in advance. Additional class times to be determined.

### \*ATTENTION BY PHYLLIS\*

Phyllis has written a great article regarding things you can do as a trainer to help keep your dog's attention. Be sure to take the time and read it carefully and do go back to it from time to time.

### **BUILDING ATTENTION HABITS BY PHYLLS BRODERICK**

To get attention you have to give your dog your 100% attention.

The way a dog learns to pay attention is for you to do something every time the dog looks away or is distracted. If you are not paying attention to your dog and it looks away and you miss it, there is nothing you can do if you don't see it. You have missed an opportunity for attention. When training never take your eyes off your dog.

Organize your training sessions.

Have a plan, whether it is for 5 minutes or longer. You must have a start and finish. Plan your training session. It will be helpful if you have a written lesson plan.

Consider crating your dog before training. Put your dog in its crate or in a quiet part of the room on a mat.

Set up your ring. Have your treats, training equipment, a bowl of water before you start your training session.

Start your training session with your dog coming out of the crate or you go to the place you put your dog, pick up the leash and start your training session.

Avoid interruptions during your training session. If someone interrupts you, you put your dog into a sit or a down, take care of the interruption. Then go back to your dog and restart your training session. Never speak to someone during your training session and let the dog look off, sniff or wander.

With some dogs, multiple short sessions are better than a long one. Train for 10 minutes, take a break, put the dog in the crate or mat. You rest or sit down for 5 or 10 minutes, then resume training.

Never command or signal a dog that isn't paying attention.

Never continue an exercise when you do not have your dog's attention.

Never reward a dog that isn't paying attention.

Decide what your goals are. Work toward that goal


