## *RALLY NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP AND NATIONAL OBEDIENCE CHAMPIONSHIP 2023*

This was held from June 16 to June 19 for Rally and Obedience in Wilmington, Ohio. It takes place at the Roberts Center not too far from the quaint little Town of Wilmington, Ohio. For Rally, one has to have scores of 93 or higher in order to participate in Rally from Novice to Masters. Then the names go into a drawing from which entries are chosen. This year the AKC added an extra day for Rally. We are hoping that Judy Skorup and Kim Folander will send us an article for inclusion in the August newsletter on their insights as to participating in the RNC. As far as we know, they were the only two members from ADTC who competed this year. Entrants also participate in 8 rings under 8 different judges.

The Obedience National Championship is by invitation only. It consists of two days and 8 rings in which each dog does two or three Open and Utility exercises in each ring. After the first day which was Sunday June 18 this year, the entries were whittled down to the Top 50 dogs who start over on Monday morning. They still go into each of the 8 rings again. After each of the 50 dogs and handlers finished their 8 rings, that 50 number was again whittled down to the Top Twenty dogs and handlers who again compete in the 8 rings. Each ring has combined Open and Utility exercises. That 20 was then whittled down to the Top 10 who again went into each of the 8 rings but this time under two judges in each ring who are not allowed to compare notes or talk to each other about the entries. The final scores are ....all compiled with the winner as the one with the highest score.

We highly recommend that you check out videos on AKCTV as well as scores for RNC and NOC on their Facebook sites. The awards ceremonies are also on video. Do take the time to check it out and see how great dogs and their handlers work. There is a lot to learn by watching them in action.

There is something that I would like to add to this not related to the handlers' and dogs' performances. And this is also something for members to consider and be aware of. When watching this you will see most if not all the judges nicely dressed, both men and women. This is not the first time; I have been disgusted by some of the handlers' sloppy dress and that includes wearing shorts AT SUCH A PRESTIGIOUS EVENT. In fact, it is the highest honor in our sport to be in that event in both rally and Obedience. This is a prestigious event that is being televised. I am not sure if the participants are aware of this. Please show respect for the sport and the judge by dressing in nice pants or jeans and a nice top or vest over a top. And that goes also for our local trials. It only reflects badly on your performance by dressing as though you came in from working in the garden.
