The National Obedience Championship is by invitation only based on OTCH points. More on this will be down further in the newsletter.

Please be sure to check your emails to make sure that classes are still being held. From those I have talked to, all are more than willing to train in hot weather, as we know how valuable our classes are. For those of you who are taking classes in Beginner Novice and Novice, this is a wonderful opportunity to find out what it is like working in a ring environment. It does not matter if you feel your dog or you aren't ready, it is a match and you can work on whatever you want (even playing in the ring) and it is most important, for the EXPERIENCE and making it fun for your dog. And best of all, it is in the same building where you are taking classes and where the actual trial will be held a few days later.

We hope to see that almost every slot is filled by our students!! Also, most of the experienced trainers, normally enter their dog more than one time. So do not wait to enter and if you have any questions, see your instructor or talk to any of our more experienced members.

November will be here before we know it and Terry, and the Club will <u>need lots of helpers</u>. So, mark your calendars with these dates. Wednesday, November 1, will be a members only rally match, Thursday, November 2, will be a rally trial, Friday, November 3 will be a members only match, Saturday, November 4, will be an obedience match open to the public, and Sunday, November 5 will be a "bare bones" obedience point trial.



Even though getting an awards and recognition for what you have achieved in 2022 is an ACHIEVEMENT AND QUITE AN HONOR IN ITSELF for each year. But some of us have ACHIEVEMENTS each month which we love to list in the newsletter. Although all those getting recognition at our Awards Celebration belong in the ACHIEVEMENT COLUMN, we also want to recognize those who have ACHIEVEMENTS each month. No ACHIEVEMENT is too small to be listed here. It is your column each month.

<u>Pat McAnally and CJ (Cosmopolitan and So It Goes)</u> finished his Rally Intermediate title in July at the Princeton Dog Trialing Club trial. He had a first place with a score of 100 and a second place with a score of 97!! Pat said she finally understands the loose leash concept! BIG BIG CONGRATULATIONS!!! GREAT SCORES.

Pat also reported that CJ completed his PT in Sheepherding title at Scarlett Mills Farm. Pat told me that PT stands for PRE-TRIAL TESTED ON HEAVIER ANIMALS such as mature sheep. It is the second level before CJ will start to herd the flightier trial sheep. WOW!! That is exciting to see your dog doing that but scary that he might get hurt. BIG BIG CONGRATULATIONS TO YOU BOTH! It is great seeing our dogs doing different things and especially things they were bred to do.





RALLY NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

As was mentioned last month, two of our members attended the Rally National Championship in July in Wilmington, Ohio. <u>Judy Skorup with her Great Pyrenees, Emma</u>, attended this prestigious event for the second time. She has qualified six times but decided to compete in Masters last year and this year. <u>Kim Folander and Charlie, her Boxer,</u> also competed last year and for the second time this year. Last year she and Charlie competed in Intermediate. Previously this event for Rally was held for only one day, but this year AKC added the extra day. We asked both Judy and Kim to write something on their experience there especially since it went from one day since its inception to two days.

Although Kim does not show Charlie herself, she has a handler who shows him for her. She thought that it was a wonderful experience and urged others to attend the one next year if they qualify. It was held at the Roberts Center in Wilmington, Ohio once again. She felt that making it two days was much better than trying to squeeze everything into one day. In order to qualify you do need scores of 93 or better in all the venues from Novice on up to Masters. She urges those who qualify to enter, although entries go into a lottery to be chosen. She did feel AKC should hand out more ribbons because of the large number of entries.

For anyone interested or thinking about attending next year, you will know once the AKC lists all the qualifiers in 2023 around February or March. Judy wrote a great article on what the rules are, how to apply and how to be accepted and hopefully have your name drawn, which some classes have a long waiting list. And, most all, you will experience what it is like to compete in a large national event with dogs and trainers from all over the USA and Canada.

In mid-June 2023, the AKC held their Rally National Championship in Wilmington, Ohio at the Roberts Centre. The mornings and evenings were cooler than in July 2022 and less humid. This year, the Rally Championship trial was divided over two days, with most classes competing twice on one day and only once on the other day. Eligibility was determined by qualifying scores earned between December 1, 2021 – November 30, 2022. Your dog had to have earned a title at that level during those months and had to have earned at least 3 scores at that level of 93 or more points out of 100. Championship classes competed four times: once each in Master, Choice, Excellent and Advanced classes. The 216 exhibitors in the Championship level class were divided into six groups of 35 exhibitors each = a challenge to walk each course and really learn it in 10 minutes with 34 other people on the course too. The Master level class had 55 exhibitors, the Excellent level had 146 exhibitors, the Advanced level had 128 exhibitors, Intermediate had 102 exhibitors and Novice had 192 exhibitors. Maps of all courses at your level, the times you had to walk the course(s) in the early am (7:30 - 8:30 am), and your ring #s (between 1 - 8) were given to you Thursday afternoon before the trials began. The trials began at 8:30 am and went until finished – easily 5:30-6:00 pm for the Championship level. Exhibitors lined up early to set up crates and chairs outside the huge room. Each exhibitor was given an area 3' x 5' for your crate, chair, and gear. This was a little tight for those of us with giant breed dogs! There was a Great Dane, a Leonberger, two Newfoundlands, two Bernese Mt. Dogs, a Greater Swiss Mt. Dog, my Great Pyrenees, and a Mastiff. I saw quite a few exhibitors I had met at various trials in PA, NJ and DE plus several judges I had shown to in the past! The eight rings were set up in two groups of four rings with a practice ring at one end of the room next to the crating area. There was activity, noise, people, and dogs everywhere. There were a few dog supply/accessory vendors in the lobby and at one end of the huge room.

I had Emma in the trial room most of Thursday afternoon to get her accustomed to the noise, people, dogs and set up. We walked around the huge room several times, she sniff inspected the ring gates, the vendors' booths, hallways, went in and out various doors and walked the grounds of the center and nearby hotel. She had time to get used to her crate and our neighbors, something she needed to get her out of total livestock guardian mode.

A professional photographer took dog and dog plus owner portraits Thursday afternoon before the trial began. Emma and I had our eight-minute session in the late afternoon. While the trial was progressing in all eight rings, the photographers were snapping photos of every exhibitor in every ring all day long. Rings 1 and 8 had videographers at work non-stop. Emma and I were in rings 3 and 4, so no video this year I thought. Not true! AKC decided to video several giant breed dogs in action: a Saint Bernard, a Newfoundland, and a Great Pyrenees. We were not at our best on that course, but we did qualify and showed that a giant breed can successfully compete at the Rally Master level, just not at a fast pace nor perfectly.

This year the AKC accepted 300 more dogs than in 2022. Acceptance into the event was different in 2023. Normally your entry is either accepted or you are on a wait list. If your wait list number is very high, you do not get in. In past years, we were on the wait list at #40 for Intermediate and #42 in Novice and our entry fee was returned both times. This year I received a letter telling me I was "on hold". They had filled the 40 spots in the Master class but would see if all the other classes filled before accepting additional exhibitors into the Master class. After entries closed, we received our acceptance notification. It helped to have two days for the competition, but the wait to compete was very, very long (6-8 hours) and tiring. It was also better to only have to compete once or twice during the day, not three or four times, at least for a mature Great Pyrenees. With over 800 dogs entered, the judges had two very long days and really

kept the exhibitors moving. Unlike at our normal local/semi local shows, there was very little conversation. Most judges' greetings were "#___, come into the ring. Are you ready? Forward." If your dog paused for more than a couple seconds or did a sign incorrectly, you heard "Move on to the next sign". At no level could you repeat any sign!

For me, one unattractive part of this event was the attire of some exhibitors.

Some obviously forgot or didn't care that there were video cameras and cameras with huge telephoto and zoom lenses aimed at every ring all day long. Many photos were taken of exhibitors' backs and while aiming at our dogs, the cameras also focused on the human body from the waist down. With most competitors aged 50+, the sights were, at times, not beautiful. Several lady exhibitors chose to wear tight shorts and tops with flip flops; others needed a little more coverage or support on the top. Although the clothing guidelines for companion dog events have been relaxed since I began competing almost 25 years ago, I still don't wear shorts or blue jeans into the Obedience or Rally ring. As long as I have a Great Pyrenees, I will always wear white or off-white slacks and matching footwear in the Rally and Obedience ring and never a skirt!

In conclusion, the AKC Rally National Championship was a wonderful experience, I am very glad Emma qualified, was invited to compete (for a sixth time) and that we went to Ohio. Again, this year, Emma was one of several Great Pyrenees eligible and invited to attend the RNC, but she was the only one who went. She has competed at both the Rally Master and Rally Championship levels at this event, no small accomplishment for her breed. We were surrounded by Border Collies, Aussies, and Golden Retrievers who usually went very quickly and effortlessly through the courses, but there were other breeds who completed the courses at a more leisurely pace like Emma. We did not go with the goal of earning a combined score to put us in the top 20 or even top 50, we went to do our best, have some fun with other exhibitors and represent the Great Pyrenees breed. If your dog is eligible next year, do enter, go, set up your dog's crate with or near exhibitors you know, compete, and enjoy being at a competition where you and your dog are among the best Rally dogs in the USA at your level!


